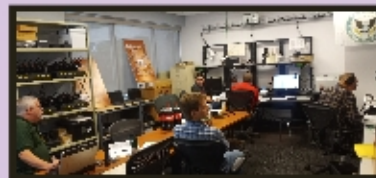


Ham Radio Operators Provide Communications for El Tour de Tucson

Have You Paid Your EAARS Dues for 2024?

EAARS is now set up to receive Zelle payments directly from members. This is an additional way to pay your dues, in addition to cash, check, and PayPal. Some advantages to using Zelle is that it goes directly into the EAARS bank account, within a few seconds, and saves the member from writing a check.

The advantages for EAARS is that the money goes directly into our account, no need for Larry to check the PayPal account, or get the checks from the P.O. box, endorse them, then take them to the bank. When we get a payment this way, the sender's name is displayed on the bank statement, so we know the sender immediately. Also, there is a place on Zelle for the sender to specify what the money is for, and in that spot he can put his callsign, which helps out a lot because we don't always recognize a name, but the callsign saves looking up the name.

Zelle is same as cash, there are no fees for us to receive the funds, and most banks do not charge the users any fees either. So the dues remain at \$24, same amount as cash or check.

Zelle is available from many banks and credit unions, so if a person is already set up, is very simple to do.

Dues must be paid before December 15th, in order to be eligible for the gift certificate drawing in January.

What? Quartzfest® is an annual HAM Radio RV and tenters Boondocking event which is held in late January every year with dates coinciding with the Quartzsite Arizona "RV Show".

When? January 21st thru 27th of 2024 (make sure you add these important dates to your 2024 calendar)

Where? 7 miles south of Quartzsite Arizona - on US 95 at La Paz Valley Road

Who Can Attend? ANYONE! If you don't have your Amateur Radio Operators License yet, you'll be able to take your Amateur Radio Operators License Exams at Quartzfest®

Cost? FREE!!!!

Our Annual Amateur Radio "get together" is called "Quartzfest®" and is open to ALL to attend. Quartzfest® is not a club, no officers, no budget and no dues..and is absolutely FREE!! During the week of Quartzfest®, RV's are everywhere across the desert, as far as you can see..every make and model you can imagine!

There are hundreds of groups that meet in Quartzsite every year in different parts of the desert who share like interests. Our group, Quartzfest®, started out in 1997 as just a few HAM RV'ers getting together, camping in their RV's in the middle of the desert..no power, no running water. Solar Panels and Generators are in use everywhere (Porta-Potties are available for our tent campers and day visitors).

Quartzfest® is similar to a Hamfest but lasts an entire week and is packed full of scheduled Seminars and Activities. Talks range in topics from Genealogy and Crafts for Non-HAM's to Solar Power and Battery Information, Technical information for the seasoned HAM, and introductory information for the new HAM. Also included in the week's activities are VE Amateur Radio License Testing, Antenna Walkabout (touring other HAM's RV Antenna installations), Solar Walkabout, 4x4 Off Road Trip in the Desert, Prospecting, Campfires (some with musical entertainment), Pot Luck dinner, Hootenanny and lot's more!

We Camp on BLM (Bureau of Land Management) land which is FREE, but you can only camp there for 14 days at a time.

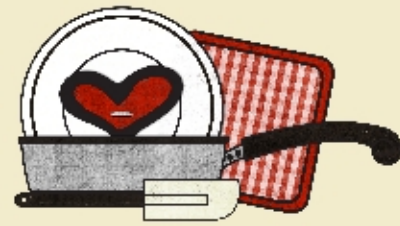

Cheesy Chile Pull-Apart Bread

Whoever invented pull-apart bread should be awarded a medal. The genius is in the cross-hatch slicing method, which allows you to tuck cheese and other fillings into every bite so that there's no fighting over the good bits. Here, those "good bits" include a green chile and garlic butter, plus an exceptional amount of spicy pepper Jack cheese. Don't be shy about getting the butter mixture and cheese all the way to the bottom of the cuts—it's the key to getting a pull of cheese in every bite. Shopping tip: Avoid a sourdough loaf, which will amp up the chilies' tanginess too much.

Ingredients

- ½ cup (4 oz.) unsalted butter
- 1 (4½-oz.) can hot diced green chiles, drained
- 1 tablespoon minced garlic (from 4 medium garlic cloves)
- ¼ teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 (1-lb.) oval crusty white bread loaf
- 8 ounces pepper Jack cheese, shredded (about 2 cups)
- ¼ cup thinly sliced scallions (from 1 bunch)

Hands On Time: 10 mins

Total Time: 30 mins

Yield: 6 serves

Directions

1. Preheat oven to 350°F. Line a baking sheet with aluminum foil. Melt butter in a small saucepan over medium-low. Add chiles, garlic, and salt; cook, stirring constantly, until fragrant, about 1 minute. Remove from heat; set aside.
2. Cut 1-inch-thick slices into bread loaf toward but not through the bottom, leaving a 1-inch bottom. Turn loaf 90 degrees, and repeat process, creating a crosshatch pattern in loaf. Using your fingers, gently pull apart openings in loaf.
3. Place loaf on prepared baking sheet. Spoon butter mixture into and around openings in loaf. Press cheese into openings, partially filling the gaps. Bake in preheated oven until cheese is completely melted, about 18 minutes. Sprinkle with scallions; serve immediately.
